**A BILL FOR AN ACT TO NAME CERTAIN ROADS AND BRIDGES
WITHIN THE REPUBLIC OF LIBERIA**

PREAMBLE

Whereas, over the past years succeeding and present Governments engaged in numerous infrastructure development projects, including the construction, renovation, and development of roads and bridges;

Realizing, that it is befitting and expedient to name certain roads, bridges, national monuments and infrastructures, thereby dedicating them in commemoration of the lives and memories of certain persons who played meaningful roles in the history, society and culture of the nation;

Being aware, that at the time of completion and dedication of these projects, past and present Governments of Liberia, in consultation with the relevant stakeholders designated certain naming conventions for them;

Recalling that, Article 34 (1) of the Constitution of Liberia gives the power to the Legislature to enact laws in furtherance of the above; and

NOW THEREFORE,

It is enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Republic of Liberia in Legislature assembled:

SECTION 1: ENACTMENT

That from and immediately upon the passage of this Act, certain roads and bridges within the Republic of Liberia shall bear and carry the names and destinations:

SECTION 2: NAMING OF ROADS.

- a. That the reconstructed road beginning at the point designated as Red Light in Paynesville, Montserrado County and thence running Two Hundred Fifty-four (254) Kilometers to the City of Ganta, Nimba County, is hereby named **MADAM SUAKOKO HIGHWAY.**

b. That the constructed and reconstructed roads beginning at the point designated as Red Light in Paynesville, Montserrado County and thence running Thirteen Point Two (13.2) Kilometers to Freeport, Bushrod Island, Montserrado County, is hereby named **JAPAN FREEWAY**.

c. That the reconstructed road beginning at the point designated as Cotton Tree, Margibi County and thence running from Eighty Point Eight (80.8) Kilometers to the Port of Buchanan, Grand Bassa County, is hereby named **DIAHN-BLAE GBEHZOHN HIGHWAY**.

SECTION 3: NAMING OF BRIDGES.

a. That the constructed bridge over the Stockton Creek that connects Duala, Bushrod Island to Upper Caldwell is hereby named **JACOB SAMUEL MELTON BRIDGE**.

b. That the constructed Waterside Bridge that connects Waterside to Bushrod Island is hereby named **KING ZULU DOMA BRIDGE**.

c. That the reconstructed bridge commonly known as Mechlin Bridge, Grand Bassa County is hereby named **TARR GARDOUR BRIDGE**.

d. That the constructed Bridge that connects Margibi and Bong Counties is hereby named **KOLLEH GWEE BRIDGE**.

e. That the St. John River Bridge within Grand Bassa County connecting the City of Buchanan is hereby named **ABBA G. KARNGA BRIDGE**.

SECTION 4: EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Act shall take effect immediately upon the publication into handbill.


